

College Prep: A To-Do List for Juniors

Below you will find a to-do list of items to keep Juniors on track as they approach the college application process. In the “Completed at FHS” list are those items which will be completed with Mrs. Lape beginning in October. The remaining items should be addressed by the student this Spring.

Completed at FHS:

- ✓ October 2017: Take the PSAT
- ✓ October 2017: Review results of ACT Aspire (taken in Spring 2017) and review college testing details such as SAT/ACT test dates, finding test preparation online. Encourage students to register for Spring test date
- ✓ January 2018: Review results of PSAT, distribute score reports and instruct students to use Khan Academy (Free SAT prep from College Board – individualized according to PSAT results)
- ✓ January 2018: College prep information session with Mrs. Lape
- ✓ Feb/March 2018: Naviance log-in and Career Interest Profiler Survey completed with review of results

To be completed by student:

- College research and campus visits – make use of Naviance feature “Colleges I’m thinking about” to track schools of interest
- Independent study and preparation for ACT/SAT using Khan Academy and other resources
- Register and sit for at least one ACT/SAT Spring 2018 date

SAT Subject Tests

Some colleges require the SAT Subject Tests in addition to the SAT. Typically, it is the highly selective colleges that may require these additional tests in their application process. Each SAT Subject Test is one hour in length. Students can take one, two, or three tests on any test administration date. However, the SAT and the SAT Subject Tests cannot be taken on the same test date. Students should take responsibility to familiarize themselves with the admissions requirements for all colleges of interest to them. Information can be reviewed on college websites.
